



SEA ADVENTURES

Belize's coastline, cayes and inviting waters beckon to water sports enthusiasts with an array of unforgettable options. Whether your clients are looking for high-adrenaline fun or seaside relaxation, there is a wealth of choices from adventure tour companies and local outfitters.

Fly Fishing in the Flats

With more than 200 miles of flats, Belize is a fly-fishing paradise and an ideal spot to catch bonefish, tarpon, permit and snook. Snook stay closer to the mainland in flats and rivers and are easiest to catch from March through November.

Northern and Central Belize

Bonefishing in Ambergris Caye and Caye Caulker is great family fun and central Belize's Turneffe Atoll is the spot for beginners. The cayes in the north are also the place to hook tarpon, as the largest (up to 120 lbs.) are found there. Smaller permit are found near Ambergris Caye.

Southern Belize

The south is the best place to find bonefish, which thrive in the waters around Glover's Reef Atoll, Tobacco Caye, South Water Caye, Placencia and Dangriga in the winter. For tarpon, a great migration arrives in February from Hicks and St. George Cayes down to Bluefin Range. The clear waters off of Punta Gorda (the permit capital of Belize) and Placencia make it a top spot for even novice fishermen.

Reef/Offshore Fishing

Big-game fish like marlin, sailfish and kingfish are prevalent in deeper waters and fishing boats are readily available to take your clients out on an unforgettable excursion. To protect the reef and Belize's eco-system, fishermen adhere to a "catch and release" policy.

Sailing + Boating + Sea Kayaking

With water, water everywhere in Belize, options include airboat rides through the mangroves with tours accessible near Belize City and the New River Lagoon in the Orange Walk District. Sailing through the Belize Barrier Reef is a once-in-a-lifetime experience and crewed charters are available in Belize City, the cayes and Palencia. Catamaran rentals are ideal for exploring the sandy cayes and many resorts offer their own excursions. Sea kayakers will find much to discover along the coast, but a trip to Sapodilla Cayes Marine Reserve on the southernmost tip of the barrier reef is particularly scenic.

Wind Sports

Belize's 174 miles of protected coastline, gentle Caribbean breezes and turquoise waters inspire visitors to indulge in wind-sports activities. While parasailing is popular in Ambergris Caye and Caye Caulker, there are experienced guides at each stop along the coast who invite your clients to try windsurfing, kiteboarding, jet skiing and aqua biking.
